Sunday Morning Workshops

College of Chiropractic Sciences (Canada) Workshop

Overview – Clinicians will be trained how to critically appraise the scientific literature regarding conservative therapy for upper extremity conditions. An overview of the Scottish International Guidelines Network (SIGN) criteria will be given as well as small group sessions working with the SIGN criteria to critically appraise randomized control trials. Practitioners will come away from this workshop with a stronger understanding of the current literature and the tools with which to continue to critically appraise studies in the future.

Outcomes

- The practitioner will be trained to use the SIGN criteria for randomized control trials.
- The practitioner will practice critical appraisal of RCT in facilitated small group sessions.
- The practitioner will gain an understanding of the current literature regarding conservative therapy for upper extremity conditions and tools with which to continue to critically appraise RCTs.

Canadian Chiropractic Specialty College of Physical & Occupational Rehabilitation Workshop

Overview – When a horse is not a horse but a zebra - Unusual case studies that are common to chiropractic practice will be presented with a special focus on their clinical management utilizing evidence-based interventions.

Outcomes

- The participant will review a series of common upper extremity cases that are often misdiagnosed in clinical practice
- The participant will learn how chiropractor can be involved in managing patients who present with these conditions in both solo-practitioner and multidisciplinary environments.

College of Chiropractic Orthopedists (Canada) Workshop

Overview – Cases will be presented in a problem-based learning format. These upper extremity clinical scenarios are complex cases that will challenge the practitioner in their clinical decision making process. They will highlight evidence-based orthopedic tests of the shoulder and the upper extremity as a whole.

Outcomes

- The practitioner will review a complex shoulder case using a clinical algorithm
- The practitioner will practice the latest valid Orthopedic tests of the shoulder and upper extremity
- The practitioner will learn how to evaluate peripheral n. entrapments of the upper extremity, versus cervical radiculopathy and other neurological disorders of the upper extremity
